### **Science Focus in Class 2**

Hands on exploration of scientific evidence is so important for children to understand and engage with Science and scientific ideas, especially those ideas beyond our living memory. Class 2 have been learning about rocks and fossils and we were really lucky to be allowed to borrow two incredible loan boxes from The Museum of Wales

in collaboration with the Faulkes Telescope Project and the Science and Technology Facilities Council. These amazing loan boxes contained cast fossils of dinosaur vertebrae, teeth and claws, as well as meteorite pieces found all over the world. We learnt the different between a "fall" and a "find" and were able to apply our geographical knowledge in identifying where the meteorites fell. The most incredible rock we

held was the Carbonaceous Chondrite, which was 4.56 billion years old! A sense of quiet and awe fell over the whole class as we passed this amazing rock around: the oldest thing we will ever touch.

We have also learnt about the different jobs that people do within the fields of geology and using the Association of Science Education diversity within careers resources, we learnt about the Earth Scientist, Anjana Khatwa who studies fossils to learn about the creatures that lived in the sea over 150

million years ago and Brianna Green, a Biogeochemist (we loved that job title!) who explores the Arctic permafrost to understand how global warming is affecting microbes that live in frozen soil.

Other fossils that we have been lucky to be able to handle and classify were found underneath a house

> while it was being renovated! These incredible finds allowed us to classify them as Cast Fossils, Mould Fossils or Trace Fossils and we also made our own examples of each kind of fossil, using our knowledge of how they were each formed.

> We are really excited to welcome two local geologists, Neville and Sally Hollingsworth to our school in November. Neville and Sally were

responsible for finding and excavating mammoth bones from a huge site near Latton and have appeared in the David Attenborough documentary, The Mammoth Graveyard. We looked at where they had made these finds and located them on maps. Their most recent discovery was fossil evidence of topical seas in a farmer's field near Stroud! They will be bringing some of their finds to show us and talking to us about how they made their discoveries. We will be inviting parents and carers to join us for this exciting morning.
