Author Opens New School Library

Author Anthony Burt spent the day inspiring the pupils and running writing workshops before officially opening the new school library at Down Ampney C of E Primary School this month. The children were fascinated to find out the various organisations that Anthony writes for as well as writing children's fiction.

Throughout the day the children engaged in drama, writing and illustrating their own stories as well as being the first people to hear part of his new book. The day ended with all parents joining the children at reading cafés in each classroom to share the love of reading.

The library has been a year in the making from the children's first idea to transform an under-used room into a warm and cosy place to share books. The children worked with a local carpenter to realise their requirements of a tree, the planes that landed during the war and a returns box built into the design.

The whole school then undertook a 24-hour "readathon" to start the fundraising process.

A variety of other fundraising activities saw the library start to take shape and one last fundraising effort to sponsor a wildflower mural enabled the children's dream to come true. Local artist Laura Wright has very kindly painted the beautiful wildlife around the tree to create the perfect place to sit and share a book.

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NatWest Money Sense

Map Skills Day

At the end of term, all classes took part in a map skills session. Reception set up a map for a BeeBot to follow and used really careful directional

language to programme it! Class 1 looked at a range of different types of map and talked about their purpose. They then drew an aerial map of the school from memory, decided where to hide an egg and marked the spot with an X. Class 2 used their



maps later, to find the eggs. Class 2 and 3 used Ordnance Survey maps to explore map symbols, 4 and 6 figure grid references and measure real distances using the scale bar.
