<u>Year 3</u>

How do adults help us?

<u>Year 5</u>



What makes us feel safe?

<u>Year 3</u>

Adults in the classroom help us feel safe. Adults in our school sort out problems and protect us. <u>Year 4</u>

<u>Year 5</u>

<u>Year 6</u>

The new fence around the school keeps us safe from strangers or danger. They help keep children inside as well. I feel safe knowing I have my friends around me. Adults help by listening and being aware of our problems or worries.









How do we care for each other?

<u>Year 3</u>

We always try and include everyone in our games and play. We tell the teacher if child is hurt or sad so that they feel less alone. We listen to each other's ideas and help them with their work if they are stuck.

<u>Year 4</u>

We help each other if we see anyone get hurt or we get help for them. We support each other by cheering others on and encouraging them to do the best they can. We know to be kind and to treat people how you would want to be treated.

<u>Year 5</u>

We give each other space when we need to. We are polite and truthful and always try to be encouraging and respectful. We are given strategies to help us be more thoughtful and to think carefully before we speak. We think: Is it true? Is it helpful?

<u>Year 6</u>

We think carefully before we speak out about something. We talk to each other and try and work out our difficulties. We have fun and laugh together. We use kind words and try not to retaliate if we get angry with someone or a situation. We ask each other how we are feeling and listen carefully to their response. We try to include everyone in our games and activities, so they don't feel left out. We cheer each other on and encourage each other's dreams.





How do we know how to behave?

<u>Year 3</u>

We are told our school rules when we start school. We are also taught about respect and hoe to behave through worship. The older children are good role models to us and help us to make good choices. We know our school values.

<u>Year 4</u>

<u>Year 3</u>
