Computing

Class 3 enjoyed a day of programming. We were very excited when our microbits arrived in school recently and could not wait to use them.

We programmed the LEDs to display our names. We wrote the code on our laptops and downloaded it to our microbits.

The next step was to add code so that when the buttons were pressed different words appeared.

We then changed the input from buttons to an accelerometer and wrote code to generate numbers randomly - a little like rolling a dice.

Some children took the dice challenge further, such as when the microbit selected below a 4 then you get a tick and above a 4 you get a cross. Sounds effects were also programmed!

The final challenge was to create a pedometer. Some children added sound when they reached every 10th step, others added a multiplier so each step counted twice.
