Democracy	<p>Children learn to work with other children in a team to create and perform music.</p> <p>Children listen to other children's ideas and opinions</p>	<p>Music lessons provide an opportunity for children to express themselves freely, forming their own opinions about the music they listen to.</p> <p>In music lessons, children may vote to demonstrate how they feel about a particular piece of music.</p>
