Democracy	Children learn to work with other children in a team to create and perform music. Children listen to other children's ideas and opinions	Music lessons provide an opportunity for children to express themselves freely, forming their own opinions about the music they listen to. In music lessons, children may vote to demonstrate how they feel about a particular piece of music.
Rule of Law	Children know that they have to take care of the instruments, so they don't become damaged. Children learn to be an appreciative and supportive audience who listen attentively while others perform.	Children learn that it is important to follow the 'conductor's' directions when we are performing together.
Individual Liberty	Children can make choices about different percussion instruments they would like to play and different roles in performance.	Children can choose to take part in Choir club. Children are taught about self-discipline and that to be successful, you must have a mindset that anything can be achieved.
Mutual Respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	Children can sing songs and listen to music from different countries and cultures.	Children enjoy listening to and performing music from different faiths and culture around the world. Children learn how music is used in other cultures and faiths.
