As part of the process of joining the Corinium Academic Trust, we invited fellow professionals to conduct a Quality of Education review. We're delighted to report that outcome was all that we'd hoped.

Map skills with Prof peter

Key Stage 2 undertook a Geography fieldwork session observing, measuring and recording human



features in the local area. Our enquiry question was "In what ways can we map small areas?" Children took measurements at right angles from a 30m line and mapped the locations of headstones, using scaled



measurements and used compasses to locate North. Children looked at the dates on headstones and how they were arranged within the churchyard. Professor Peter joined us and pointed out the land survey marks on the church wall from when the land was first mapped before satellite images.



Mummification

In Class 2, children explored the process of mummification by mummifying an orange! The



children worked collaboratively to scoop out the inside of the orange, make sure it was dry, fill it up with spices and finally wrap it! The children went on to write their own set of instructions on the process of mummification.

Well done to our award winners who have demonstrated our school values this term.




Supporting the School
