#### This week

We have had a busy 4-day week with interviews (more information below) as well as a mini history unit all about VE day where the children were not only able to learn about the events of 80 years ago but also the lasting impact on the world we live in. We ended yesterday with a whole school worship where we shared diary entries, prayers for peace and did some lovely singing.

#### **Next week**

Children in Year 2 and Year 6 will be taking part in the end of key stage assessments (Year 2s are likely to go beyond next week and are less formal). This always marks a key milestone in the Year 6 calendar as from this point on they get to wear their hoodies every day and the level of homework decreases! We will also be marking the end of the Y6 SATs with the whole school by being off timetable on Friday. Also on Friday, we have the school disco and class 3 sleepover.

## Staffing update

I am delighted to announce that we have appointed a new class teacher and new teaching assistants. We had a very strong field of applicants for each post and after a rigorous day long interview I can announce that Miss Chakroborty has been appointed as the new class teacher for class 1. She will be in school for a variety of visits in the summer term to get to know the children. We have also appointed Mrs Evans as the new teaching assistant alongside Mrs Ford who will be with us on a more regular basis from September.

Therefore, in class 1 there will be Miss Chakroborty, Mrs Wheeler and Mrs Paterson. Class 2 will be Miss Phipps and Mrs Walters. Class 3 will be Mrs Russell and Mrs Evans with Mrs Ford on a Monday morning.

Mrs Walters will continue to teach each class, one afternoon a week. Mrs Evans will support each class, one afternoon a week for science, and I will have an increased teaching commitment in class 1 alongside Miss Chakroborty, especially in term 1 when we welcome our new intake. I will also teach classes 1 and 3 for an afternoon each a week.

We are delighted to have such a strong staffing team for the year ahead and with all vacancies filled, we can start to plan lots of amazing things alongside our core curriculum offer.
